

INSTRUCTIONS FOR POSTER PRESENTATION

Location

Your poster board will be marked with the number given on the Final programme

Time

Your Poster will be on display from Monday to close of play Wednesday when the Conference staff will take the posters down and put them into temporary tubes ready for you to collect them the following morning from the Conference Desk at the Sage

Poster material

Your poster board will be 120 x 100 cm (portrait format, height x width). Your poster number will be displayed with large printed figures in the upper corner of the poster board. The Organizers will provide you with Velcro to set up your poster when you register.

Poster mounting

You are asked to mount your poster by 6pm on Monday 29th September or as soon as possible afterwards.

Text layout

Give a short and comprehensive review of the basic items of your study. This can be done by dividing your text into several but clearly delineated paragraphs and sections such as Introduction or Aim of Study, Materials and Methods, Result-Conclusions. Remember that it is easy to start reading a paragraph of six lines and that most people avoid one with 30. Your poster text should be enlarged so that it can be read at a distance of about one meter.

Illustration layout

Drawings, diagrams and photos are extremely helpful and often necessary to display results and conclusions. Make sure that your illustrations are easy to understand; do not overload any chart or drawing with information.
